Pete tells us "during their time out with me they are learning life skills which provides them with more confidence to deal with the world in general and to cope with situations that may arise in their own personal life."










Scott tells us "I like working with my hands, I am learning new things every day such as how to use the tools properly."



James tells us he has met lots of wonderful people in his job and it has built his confidence so much.






Roy Cheetham is a keen gardener and works at the allotments in Whitby.
